

Dear Co-Laborers,

June 11th, we were planning to visit the church in The Olives. This was impossible due to extreme rain that flooded the whole area 100 kms east of Santa Cruz. The road going in was under water for about 2 weeks with only access by air. Some homes were flooded and our church building that is in a low area had about a foot of water inside the building. None of the church family's houses were flooded.



Many families ran out of food. With no road access the government flew in by helicopter a small token amount of food, as a "political" show of support for the needy people. The church building is okay. After the water resided we were able to clean up the mess.

Please pray for 10-12 adolescents and several adults that are preparing for baptism in the church of the Olives.

Please continue to pray for 40 German believers who migrated to Bolivia from Germany. Some like Otto Bolinger and his family are doing quite well adapting to a very different language, culture, and general environment. Others are very discouraged and thinking about returning to their country. The economic crisis in Bolivia makes it hard for even the natives to find work and wages are much lower than in Germany. We pray for the Lord's strength and encouragement for these dear German believers suffering through many trials and tribulations.

During August 4th-7th Bolivian Independence Day weekend, we had a very special family

conference with several churches attending and many believers from various parts of Bolivia gathered to enjoy the Word and fellowship, during this time of spiritual
f e a s t i n g .

August 20th, our granddaughter Zoe was baptized after the morning service. I was given the privilege to baptize our precious
