Since our last letter...

We praise the Lord for His blessings in ministry. We have been teaching three times a week at St. Vincent School for the Deaf. This is in addition to the other services at church and on Zoom. We have been told that in the next school year, the Bible classes will be moved to Fridays. We'll be teaching several classes all on one day. This will be much easier on our schedule. We've been making the drive to the school three days a week.

The Zoom class for the Rwandan deaf continues every Thursday. It has been a joy to meet with them and learn their signs while teaching God's Word. Many of their signs are different from South African Sign Language. We are planning to visit the deaf there at the end of January or beginning of February. Please pray as Rwanda currently has active cases of the Marburg virus.

I was contacted by the deputy principal when one of their teachers abruptly passed away. He was well-loved by the school and students, and she wanted me to come and encourage the young people. I had the opportunity to speak to more young people than we normally do, and it was a blessing. The following Friday, the deputy principal phoned me again. "The family doesn't have a pastor. Would you be willing to preach the funeral?" The following Sunday morning the Lord allowed me to preach the Gospel to around 400+ people! About a week after the funeral, I received a call from the mother of one of the young teens from St. Vincent. She saw me preach at the funeral, obtained my cell number from the school, and gave me a call. She said she's been looking for a good church for her

daughter for a long time, so I gave her our address and church time. Lorato and her daughter came and fell in love with our church. Thank the Lord for the outreach to this school. We are praying more parents bring their children. Lorato said, "My daughter has been attending this school for a long time, and no one told us about your church!" Last month, we were asked to attend and speak at the school memorial service for the teacher. God has used Deputy Principal Desiree to open this door to us, and we are grateful.

We praise the Lord for two deaf saved in the last two weeks. Karen has been attending church with her husband since January of this year. She trusted Christ at the end of November. One of the teens from St. Vincent visited our church on December 1, and he thoroughly enjoyed our service. Mosa talked with him in private, and he trusted Jesus as his Saviour.



Please be in prayer for two upcoming events. First is our annual "December 31st All-Night New Year's Blowout." We haven't done this since Covid, so the deaf are looking forward to it. Please be in prayer for this event. We start at 5 pm on the 31st and end at 7 am on the 1st. Second is the deaf camp. Our deaf camp for 2025 is the "Deaf Bible Boot Camp." 
