Walking through this journey of parenting adult children has been bittersweet; living half way around the world from our kids has not been easy, but with the joy of seeing them happy, successful and loving Jesus is a blessing.

I was also able to spend time with my first pastor Jim Shaw, and his family, faithful servants of God. WhI can't help but be in awe of the truth found in Isaiah 51:1, which says, "Hearken to me, ye that follow after righteousness, ye that seek the Lord: look unto the rock whence ye are hewn, and to the hole of the pit whence ye are digged." As we continue on this journey with Him, He is shaping us into the image of our Savior (Romans 8:29; Philippians 1:6). This coming Saturday we will continue to reach out to our surrounding community by delivering 100 gift bags of groceries as an expression of our friendship to the community and to just let our neighbors know that we are here to serve and minister to them.

Michelle has remained in San Jose del Monte, keeping an extremely busy schedule with Bahay Sibol, processing kids, caring for the baby with special medical needs and overseeing several construction projects that are ongoing. In addition, she is handling the adoption paperwork for Carlo and Luis, which has been riddled with delays in the courts. But despite the challenge, there is a glimmer of hope and a faint light at the end of the long tunnel; she is hopeful that the papers will be accomplished and the family will be able to travel all together by summer of 2024.
